## Scotch Whisky:

There are a great many things that define Scotch whisky, many of them of legal in nature. For instance, to be called Scotch, it must have spent a minimum of 2 years in oak, contain only water, grain, and yeast, and above all, *must* be distilled and bottled in Scotland at no lower than 40% ABV. In essence, Scotch is generally a malt/grain-based whisky that features varying degrees of peat influence, and heavily utilises secondhand casks for further influence, frequently showcasing used bourbon, sherry, port, and various wine casks.

### *Speyside*

Easily the distillery capital of Scotland, Speyside is the most prominent producer of whisky out of all of the regions. Bright and gentle with delicate peat and forward fruity notes such as apple, pear, and lemon are hallmarks of its regional style. Speyside is a good place to start for those new to whisky, or if it's 10am and you need a dram to pair with breakfast.

### *Highlands*

The Highlands are Scotland's largest region geographically, covering nearly the northern two-thirds of Scotland. Highland whiskies tend to carry a fair amount of variance from one to the next, however a general rule of thumb is that the whiskies usually have a bit more richness and depth than Speyside whiskies, often employing heavy use of sherry barrels for maturation.

## SCOTLAND



### *Islay*

Islay is renowned for its heavy use of what is arguably the most divisive character found in Scotch: peat smoke. In case you're wondering, peat is essentially broken down organic matter which can be used as a fuel source—in this case applied in the process of roasting malt. Islay whiskies, in addition to smoky characters, often carry brine, saline, seaspray, and iodine notes as well. Furthermore, the peat found on Islay is comprised of different organics than that of mainland peat, containing more seaweed and oceanic content, thus bolstering the individuality of Islay style. These whiskies are generally received with either cooing adoration or utter disgust, but rarely indifference.

### *Islands*

The Islands are probably the most difficult region to categorise into style, as each distillery has its own unique approach to whisky. While there is often a coastal salinity to the whiskies, they range from floral and citrusy to smoky and bold.

### *Campbeltown*

Once home to a great many distilleries, only 3 operate today. While these whiskies don't typically contain the level of peat that Islay drams generally do, they can still deliver a gentle punch of smoke and brine with rounding sweetness underneath.

### *Lowlands*

Lowland whiskies are usually categorised by their softness. Floral and heather notes are commonplace among these expressions, and while Speyside whisky is what you might pair with your breakfast, Lowland whisky would be your go-to if you are having it instead of your breakfast.

### Japanese Whisky

Japanese whisky has in recent times become very popular on a global scale. Demand has skyrocketed, resulting in increased difficulty obtaining them. Whiskies with age statements in particular have become increasingly rare, as producers simply don't have the stock to meet demand. Because of this, the market has seen a substantial increase in non-age statement whiskies available.

In terms of style, Japanese whisky runs in many ways at a parallel to Scotch whisky. However, if one had to give Japan a hallmark style, it would be probably be described as delicate and subtly complex—usually very light on peat, not massively bodied, and all about the intricate details. While this by no means is a rule, if you are looking for a massive whisky to burn a hole in your face, you'd be better off skipping Japanese whiskies. If what you are looking for is a whisky which is defined as much by what is there as what isn't, then you're in the right spot.

### Indian Whisky

India has recently been making a splash in the world of whisky—shitty pun intended. Again, like Scotch, the style is very focused around single malt style. Where the difference lies is largely in the whether. Many of the distilleries in Scotland have an average year round temp of 'bloody cold' India has a much different climate. The heat and dryness of India can age the whisky at an accelerated rate. Instead of losing ABV over time as is common with Scotch, they can actually increase in ABV when water evaporates through the barrel instead of the alcohol.

### Irish Whisky

Ireland is effectively the origin of modern whisky, going back as far back as the 12th Century. Usually, but not always, their whiskies are unpeated and triple distilled. Their drams are arguably softer than their Scottish counterparts, again often opting for elegance over loud notes.

### American Whiskey

Like Scotch, bourbon and rye whiskey must adhere to strict naming laws. To be called a bourbon, the mash must consist of at least 51% corn, be aged in virgin American oak barrels, bottled at no less than 40% ABV, and made in the USA. Rye whiskey abides by the same rules, however the mash must instead be at least 51% rye. Because of the virgin oak aging, American whiskeys very often have strong vanilla and cherry backbones. Bourbon's use of corn in the mash typically gives it a slippery mouthfeel, where rye whiskey is generally a more spicy and herbaceous expression. In addition to the virgin oak, warmer weather in the southern US will also contribute to a much faster maturation process than that of the average Scotch whiskey.

### Moonshine

The stigma is that you may as well just drink petrol; it's cheaper and probably only tastes almost as bad. Honestly, it is a great deal more drinkable and tasty than you'd think. If you want to really get an idea for what whisky is before it becomes whisky, than you should give it moonshine/white whisky shot. It is sweet and textural, and it's all about the distillation. Whisky becomes as much about the barrel that it aged in as it does about the spirit, often times trading spirit flavours for barrel flavours. While barrel aging softens a spirit, it also removes compounds and changes it. If you in any way consider yourself a purist, try some moonshine.

### Tin

As if you really need an introduction. If you are looking at this page, you are probably already well acquainted with the anatomy of a G&T. Still, for anyone who might be wondering, gin is a spirit which predominantly features juniper as its primary flavour. Aside from that, there isn't much in the way of defining rules. A well established style such as London Dry is generally citrus heavy, and distills with the botanicals directly in the still. Old Tom gin is a somewhat outdated style not seen as often, which sits a little sweeter on the scale. American gins have a tendency to be slightly more viscous, though there is a great deal of variation among them. Australian gins are at the mercy of the whims of their creators, where there is no real style that is specific to the place. Many distilleries here have taken to doing multiple expressions—it's common to see the same producer do a London Dry style, another that features Australian botanicals, and perhaps a 'Navy Strength'. If you're curious about what 'Navy Strength' is, it is a 'style' that hails from old British naval gin rations. If the strength was 57%, one could pour it on gunpowder, and it would still ignite; if it was less, it would not—thus was the way to tell whether your gin ration had been watered down.

Sloe gin, meanwhile, is essentially a gin steeped in Sloe berries. It's typically much sweeter and more tart than ordinary gin.

Also increasingly common are barrel aged gins, which are fairly self explanatory. They are great for crisp nights, and they make killer negronis.

### Rum

Generally accepted as having originated in the Caribbean, rum is a spirit which is distilled from fermented sugarcane/sugarcane products. They are usually aged to some extent, though there is no universal set of rules that really apply to how rum is made aside from what it's made from. Being produced in many parts of the world, rum is subject to the rules of its country of origin.

There are several types and grades of rum. Dark rum is generally aged in casks with heavy char, and would be classed as the most flavoursome of rums. Gold rum is a medium bodied rum offering a wide gamut of grades and flavours, from 'sipping rums' to 'only drinkable with a mixer'. White rum tends to be the least flavoursome, exhibiting itself as mostly a gentle sweetness, lending itself well to cocktails and mixing.

### Tequila, Mezcal, & You

Ahh, tequila. It brings out the feisty in a person. At least, it has that reputation; though, maybe that's just cheap tequila. In any case, mezcal and tequila are more or less brother and sister. They're both exclusively Mexican and region specific, tequila being from the state of Jalisco and a few surrounding municipalities, mezcal being largely from Oaxaca. While tequila is very specifically made from Blue Weber agave, mezcal has no specifications regarding what type of agave is used, which makes it somewhat more versatile. The two next to each other could be a dynamic duo, mezcal tending to carry deeper flavours and smoky aromas, where tequila compliments with more lifted and aromatic qualities.
